
Batu Jagchid 于崇信








Chen Wen 陳文



Fong Chung-Ray 馮鍾睿


Fong Chung-ray was born in 1934 in Nanyang, China. He arrived in Taiwan in 1949 as a soldier. In 1958, he co-founded Four Seas Art Association and in 1961 he joined the Fifth Moon Group and redirected himself from oil painting to the venture of ink painting. In the early 70s, he won a fellowship awarded by the Rockefeller III Foundation, enabling him to visit the contemporary art events in Europe and the United States. In 1975, he immigrated to the United States and settled down in the Bay area of San Francisco. He combined written characters and abstract composition, transforming Chinese characters into art. After 1989 he again opened up a new creative field: collage, in which he created texture by adding layers of colors. Fong Chung-Ray has always been strict to his own creation, loyal to his self-perception, and this way he conveys deep emotionality as well as rationality through art, carrying personal spiritual thinking and practice. He had solo exhibitions in many major museums.
